TONE is a low frequency long beep separating steps.
Expect values should be filled in when altimeter is programmed for flight, not on flight line.

Item 2a is rarely used; cross it out unless programmed so that user will not expect report and confuse steps. (It is sometimes used on B altimeter for backup apogee deployment.)

Continuity, deployment igniters:

0 = none 2 = one 3 = both.
